Bearing the motto of the city of Paris, "Fluctuat Nec Mergitur" (He/she is rocked by waves, and/but does not sink.") and an armorial as yet unidentified. Set comprises (2) 5" x 10" tazzas, a round 14" platter (crazing and staining), a 12 1/2" serving bowl, a 3 1/4" x 8" sauce boat (minor wear to rim), (2) 13 3/4" platters, (2) 15 3/4" platters, a 17 3/4" platter (crazing and a glaze flake), and a 9" x 13" handled tureen (lid with crazing).
